was recognized for her work with the Junior League of Longview. Lynch has been an active member of the Longview Junior League for four years and currently serves as its Treasurer.

The Junior League of Longview (JLL) is a woman's organization committed to promoting voluntarism and improving the community. This is accomplished through their many programs including

the annual School Supply Train, Women's Career Closet, and the Bargain Box Resale Shop. JLL also provides assistance to the Boys & Girls Club, Women's Center of East Texas, Buckner Family Services, and Windridge Therapeutic Equestrian Center. In 2009, JLL provided more than \$70,000 in financial assistance and 4,500 in volunteer hours to 20 local projects.

During the past year, Lynch also volunteered for the Haverty's Angel Tree, Habitat for Humanity, Coats for Kids and ArtsView Children's Theater. "My involvement in the League has been very rewarding and challenging. I accepted the Treasurer position, and had to hit the ground running – and very quickly," said Lynch. "My first active year in the League, I was awarded the 'Pacesetter' which was quite an honor since it was my first year as an active member."

Lynch joined Austin Bank in June 1999. She worked as a Loan Officer and Credit Analyst prior to her promotion to Location President; and developed the bank's credit analysis department. Lynch is a graduate of the University of Texas at Tyler and the Southwest Graduate School of Banking at SMU.
